



a.Implementation of GT's Operational Plans

GOAL 1

82 % of activities executed as planned

(Number of key activities/projects: 14)

In Goal 1, some activities were fully executed, as for example:

- **1.1.4.** Capture and feedback to EUROSAI members examples of good practices emerging from the work of INTOSAI CBC
- **1.4.1.** Encourage periodic self-assessment for compliance with the provisions of the Declarations of Lima and Mexico on SAIs' independence using available tools, e.g. from INTOSAI Working Group on Values and Benefits


Activities 1.2.2, 1.3.3 and 1.4.2 had no execution planned for this reporting period.

Activities with the lower execution are:

- 1.1.2 Facilitate INTOSAI Donor Cooperation in Europe
- **1.2.1.** Collect information and identify capacity building needs of EUROSAI members, including curriculums and models for professional qualification of staff, and taking into account information from available sources (e.g. IDI)

Justification:

The main reason affecting delivery of results was the complex organisation of the GT and its activities in the 1^{st} Operational Plan. So, GT1 restructured itself, simplifying tasks and task groups and approved an updated Operational Plan, where several tasks were suppressed, merged or added.



Goal 2

90 % of activities executed as planned

(Number of key activities/projects: 7)


In Goal 2, all activities were fully executed, except:

- **2.1.1** Encourage high quality translation of the ISSAI and INTOSAI GOV into the official EUROSAI languages in which the documents are not yet available
- **2.1.3** Conduct awareness raising seminars on the ISSAI framework and specific ISSAI in conjunction with INTOSAI standard-setting committees and other INTOSAI bodies

Justification:

The completion of activity 2.1.1 was affected by the need of concluding negotiations with IFAC concerning the permission to publish official Russian translations of ISA, which are still pending.

Tasks scheduled under activity 2.1.3 included the organisation of a seminar to raise awareness on the ISSAI framework. The results of the needs assessment conducted by GT2 showed that EUROSAI members are already highly aware of the ISSAI and need support mostly for implementing/applying the ISSAI (activity 2.2.2). Therefore, GT 2 concluded that awareness raising seminars are not necessary and did not proceed with this activity, which should be considered as completed.



Goal 3

70% of activities executed as planned

(Number of key activities/projects: 10)

In Goal 3, several activities were fully executed as planned, for example:

- **3.1.1** Establish and maintain a database of audits conducted by the EUROSAI members in different fields
- **3.1.3** Organise training events/knowledge sharing seminars to share experience and knowledge according to the needs identified within EUROSAI
- 3.2 Enhance audit cooperation within EUROSAI

The following activities were not implemented:

- **3.4.1** Support the Governing Board in promoting and developing cooperation with institutional partners for the 2011-2017 period
- **3.4.2** Support the Governing Board in promoting and developing cooperation with non-institutional partners where they are considered to have particular expertise or pursue matters useful to EUROSAI in its work

Justification:

The execution of activities 3.1.4 and 3.3.1 as well as the non implementation of activities 3.4.1 and 3.4.2 were affected by some overlapping or need of coordination with GT4's tasks.

It has now been decided that activities 3.3.1, 3.4.1 and 3.4.2 will mainly be developed by GT4 and, so, GT3 and GT4 Operational Plans were modified accordingly.

88 % of activities executed as planned



(Number of key activities/projects: 16)

In **Goal 4**, all activities were **fully executed** as planned, except activities 4.1.4, 4.3.2 and 4.3.6.

Activities 4.2.4 and 4.3.5 had no execution planned for this reporting period

Activity 4.3.1 was fully executed in the former reporting period.

Activities with the lower execution are:

- **4.1.4** Identify value and benefits of interaction within INTOSAI by:
 - Extracting examples from Goal Team reports
 - Analysing and highlighting the benefits to EUROSAI from these interactions (e.g. added value from broader based knowledge sharing, building on best practice cases to enhance EUROSAI effectiveness and reduce potential duplication of work) (cf. 4.3.5)
- 4.3.2 Develop and put into place a EUROSAI internal and external communication policy
- **4.3.6** Encourage the organisation of EUROSAI events in a sustainable way, including the promotion of online tools/internet conference tools

Justification:

The completion of the activities under implementation strategy 4.1 was affected by the overlapping with GT3's activities.

As for activity 4.3.2, although a draft of the communication policy was prepared, it was decided to develop it further and to proceed with consultations about that draft before finalising it.

Activity 4.3.6 is very much related to the possibility of using a collaboration platform, which had not yet been decided during the reporting period. This will be overcome in the next period.

The affected tasks will be **rescheduled** for the following period.

In the next period, GT4 will also perform activities 3.3.1, 3.4.1 and 3.4.2

29,26% of activities with tasks modified, rescheduled or cancelled

For the reasons formerly appointed:

In 22% of the activities planned tasks were rescheduled or redrafted for the next reporting period and 7,3 % of the activities have seen new tasks introduced.

b. Overall status of the implementation of the Strategic Plan

b.1. Outcomes achieved²


The EUROSAI Strategic Plan establishes **66 outcomes** to be achieved during the period of 2011-2017:


- Goal 1: 21 outcomes
- Goal 2: 11 outcomes
- Goal 3: 15 outcomes
- Goal 4: 19 outcomes

71% of the outcomes are completed or in the process of being achieved

After two years of implementation of the Strategic Plan, **21%** of the outcomes established (14) are already completed and **50%** of them (33) are partially completed. 29% of the outcomes (19) have not yet started to be implemented.

Most of the partially completed outcomes are permanent activities with no target measure. That's, for instance, the case of almost all outcomes of Goal 3, where training events, cooperative audits or cooperation projects are continuously taking place.

c. Evaluation of cross-cutting issues

Training	In the reporting period, 16 events, counting training, workshops and meetings with experience sharing content were held (see annex), organised by Goal Team 3, Working Group for Environmental Auditing, Working Group on Information and Technology, Task Force on the Audit of Funds Allocated to Disasters and Catastrophes, Task Force on Audit & Ethics and INTOSAI Development Initiative in liaison with Goal Team 2.
	More than 190 participants from, at least, 27 European SAIs , participated in seminars.
	GT3 and GT4 have taken initiatives to improve coordination in training within EUROSAI. In this scope, a specific content to be included in the new EUROSAI website about training strategies and events was developed.
	So far, 7 training events are planned for 2013-2014 in EUROSAI, as follows: •17-18 September 2013, Auditing Ethics related issues, ECA (TFA&E) •15 October 2013, Fraud and Corruption in Environmental Audit, Czech Republic (WGEA)
	 4-5 December 2013, Using the Performance Audit Guidelines (ISSAI 300 and 3000-3999) to improve Performance Audit in SAIs, Germany (GT2) January 2014, Ethics within SAIs, Portugal (TFA&E) March 2014, Best practices in auditing funds allocated to disasters, Ukraine

	We invite GT2 and the SAI of Lithuania to articulate their two events, since they relate to the same issue.
	The general part of the EUROSAI practical guide for organising training events was reviewed and updated, to provide more complete guidance in this field. A process to improve the reporting on the training organised within EUROSAI is also being developed.

	Having acknowledged that SAIs are burdened with surveys, GT4 has coordinated the issuance of surveys by GTs, avoiding overlapping of questions, merging questionnaires where possible, restricting surveys to GTs members when enough and encouraging the use of already existing alternative sources of information. It was also decided to publish a list of surveys issued in the EUROSAI website, so that all can know which questionnaires were already made and can look for the information already available. Additionally, summaries of those survey results will also be published in the EUROSAI website
Funding from the EUROSAI budget	GT's Operational Plans have identified two activities that needed funding from the EUROSAI budget. 5,168 € were spent to fund a training event . 34,276.78 € are committed by contract to pay for the implementation of the new EUROSAI website .
	For the next period, funding has being requested for a training event , in the amount of 3,600 €. Moreover, funding for another seminar and for a license to publish ISAs translation into Russian in the EUROSAI website might be requested, though the amounts are not determined yet. Information, analysis and proposal for funding requests to the GB are provided in separate
	documents.
	Having concluded last year that financial rules should be collected in a single document and revised in order to adapt them to the new EUROSAI framework, GT4 Task Group 4 prepared a draft of the EUROSAI financial rules, which is now submitted for approval of the GB.
External funding	Coordination with the INTOSAI-Donor SC is being conducted, in order to enhance the support to European developing countries SAIs and to initiatives related to them. This coordination has been made by the Presidency, the EUROSAI Secretariat and GT1.
EUROSAI website and collaboration platform	The website and a collaboration platform are key issues for the implementation of the EUROSAI Strategic Plan. Many of the planned activities and tasks of the Goal Teams depend on the availability and use of these communication tools and, so, may be fully developed from now on.
	Although the content of the current website was already updated and improved, in order to adapt it to the Strategic Plan and to include an enlarged set of documents related to the activities of the several EUROSAI groups, a new EUROSAI website has now been launched and will allow an increased availability of information within the EUROSAI community. GT4 identified a need to articulate databases that are being planned or set up by several groups, in order to avoid overlapping and complexity of information and will deal with it during the next period.
	A move to test the collaboration platform set up by the NCA for the 2014 Congress is proposed to the GB. This will allow interactive working and communication among a growing community of professionals.
Sustainability	Sustainability initiatives should implement one of the EUROSAI core values, but they are yet not covered enough in GT's Operational Plans. GT4's Task Group 5 has a specific activity to enhance that and the future GT's OPs updates should pay some attention to it as well. Website and electronic platform will contribute to sustainability. GT4 has already held a meeting through internet conference, avoiding traveling costs
Interaction with INTOSAI groups	Interactions are in place with INTOSAI Director for Strategic Planning, INTOSAI Secretariat, CBC, PSC, IDI and INTOSAI-Donor SC, through the Secretariat and members and invited experts in Goal Teams. Under initiative of GT2 Chair, GT4 agreed to support their proposal to the EUROSAI GB to approve a Resolution asking the INTOSAI GB to discuss the classification of ISSAI X in the appropriate level of the ISSAI framework. As regards cooperation with other INTOSAI Regional Organisations, EUROSAI has, so far,

	signed cooperation agreements with OLACEFS, ARABOSAI and ASOSAI and organised joint			
	conferences with these organisations. Those agreements include statements for the			
	development of practical cooperation activities and all teams have been invited to include			
	activities to implement them.			
	WGs and TFs also have interactions with correlative groups of INTOSAI, AFROSAI and ARABOSAI.			
	GT4 will reflect on how to enhance further all this cooperation.			
	During the reporting period, and through the action of GT2, EUROSAI and IDI have signed a			
	protocol and a statement of commitments for the implementation of 3i programme

	respective translation effort.			

Conclusions/Outlook

- The implementation of the EUROSAI Strategic Plan is producing most of the planned results but, in some areas, is a bit late, although its success is not compromised.
- The delivery of the defined outcomes was somehow affected by the availability of the new EUROSAI
 website and by the non-existence of a collaboration platform. Since the conditions for the
 functioning of these tools are now in place, the level of execution may increase significantly in the
 near future.
- The development of operational activities also showed some difficulties raised by the descriptions included in the EUROSAI Strategic Plan. Simplification of some activities, elimination of overlapping and fine-tuning of outcomes and performance measures are needed and maybe considered in the next mid-term review of the Strategic Plan.
- Thus, for the following period, the most important issues to be dealt with are:
 - The complete launching and use of the new EUROSAI website, including the coordination of databases
 - ♦ The test of the NCA's collaboration platform
 - The completion of the EUROSAI communication policy
 - The rethinking of the EUROSAI Magazine
 - The development of external cooperation

- The improvement of the training coordination
- ♦ The enhancement of the sustainability value
- The mid-term review of the EUROSAI Strategic Plan
